PURPOSE: To have City Council approve the 2025-26 legislative agenda.

BACKGROUND: Each year, the City of High Point meets with our state elected officials to communicate legislative and financial priorities for our community. On February 24, 2025, members of the High Point City Council and senior staff will meet with the Guilford County delegation of the North Carolina General assembly to seek support for identified needs and funding.

For this cycle, the city will prioritize high-impact projects that align with state initiatives and funding efforts already underway. These include support for the shared-use kitchen, the Center for Active Adults, and improvements to water and sewer infrastructure.

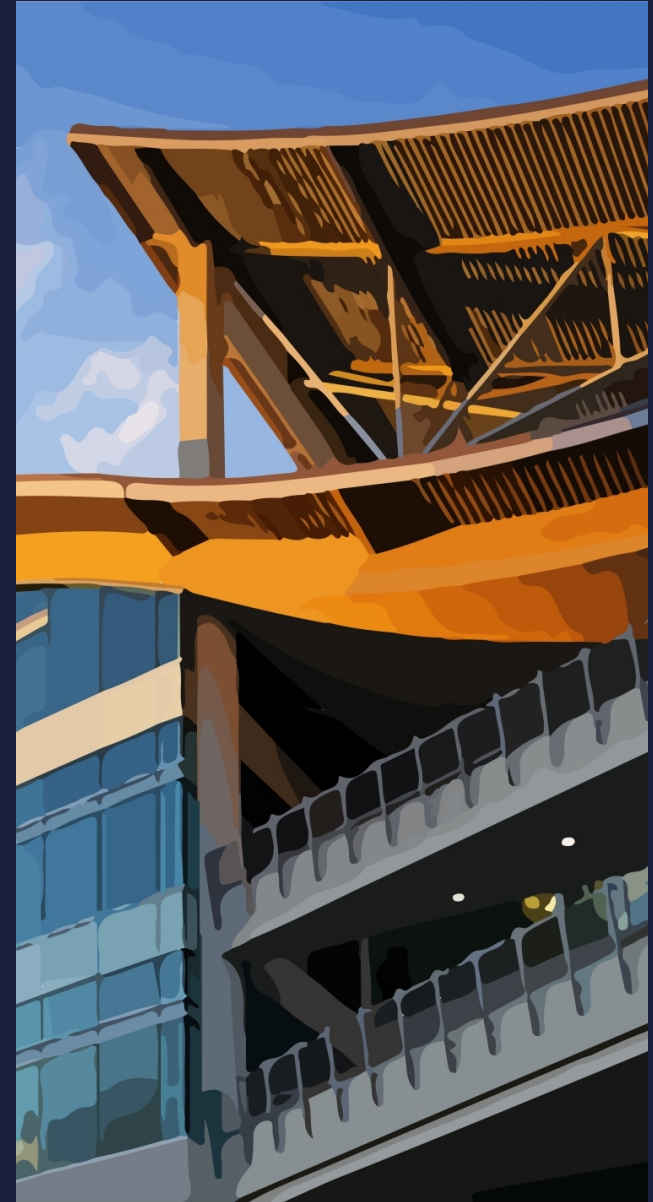
Additionally, the agenda will promote collaborative efforts with Business High Point, focusing on initiatives such as the Housing Fund, the small business program at the Shops on Washington, athletic fields and support for small-scale manufacturing at 300 Oak Street. Additionally, the city will also seek consideration regarding the impact of downzoning changes on future planning and development strategies.

CITY OF HIGH POINT PROJECTS

- **WATER MAINS & SEWER MAINS UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE \$2M**

- Additional funding support to give the City the flexibility to continue developing in high-growth areas.

- **SHARED USE KITCHEN \$2M**

- A city-supported shared-use kitchen fosters local economic growth by reducing startup costs for food entrepreneurs, creating jobs, and generating tax revenue. It also enhances community well-being by promoting food security, compliance with health regulations, and revitalizing underutilized spaces.

- **CENTER FOR ACTIVE ADULTS \$750K**

- Support for key outdoor amenities including 8 lighted pickleball courts, an outdoor paved trail, and outdoor fitness equipment along the trail. Identifying alternative funding sources for these amenities would help complete the vision for the Center and its surrounding campus.
